- ▶ **Swansea University Computer Society**
- ▶ Founded in 1988 by Alex Williams and Robin O'Leary
- ▶ Started as the Computer Science society, then became the Computer society, then the Swansea University Computer Society

- ▶ Ran a bulletin board on a machine donated by the university computing centre
This was replaced by Milliways in 1992
- ▶ A SUCS machine was used by Alan Cox to test the (then new) TCP/IP stack in Linux
`net/socket.c`:
 - * Based upon Swansea University Computer Society
NET3.039

- ▶ Since 1998, SUCS has had a room in Union House
- ▶ 2 rooms upstairs (4th floor then 3rd floor)
- ▶ SUCS moved to the current room in November 1999
- ▶ Around the same time, SUCS started offering mail and webspace to societies

Aside from the room and the social side to the society:

- ▶ Video streaming
- ▶ Games server
- ▶ Hosts CyOSM - the Welsh language render of OSM

- ▶ Still runs Milliways
- ▶ And still doesn't pay for software

- ▶ Linux is an open source kernel, originally written by Linus Torvalds
- ▶ Lots of distributions - collections of software that work with the kernel
- ▶ GNU/Linux is GNU userland software and a Linux kernel
- ▶ SUCS runs Debian on servers and Fedora on the desktops

- ▶ “creates and provides free geographic data such as street maps to anyone who wants them”
- ▶ Several SUCS members contribute to the map
- ▶ SUCS also hosts a Welsh language version of the map
